

# HORIZONS FOUNDATION 2009 GRANTMAKING

Horizons Foundation is best known for our grantmaking, which focuses on lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) organizations and causes in the San Francisco Bay Area. For 30 years, our grants have provided direct financial support to LGBT nonprofits across issues, populations, and geography.

In 2009, we made **621 grants totaling \$1,811,918** to help strengthen the LGBT community. We are deeply grateful to the individual donors, community organizations, and collaborating foundations and corporations who made this possible.

In Horizons' wide-ranging portfolio of grants, many grantees were selected using community-led grantmaking processes, while others came from donor-advised and special funds. Together, the grants—funded thanks to our generous donors, institutional partners, and the LGBT Community Endowment Fund—represent support for the full spectrum of advocacy, services, and programs that make the next generation of progress possible for the LGBT community.

# 2009 COMMUNITY ISSUES GRANTS

The cornerstone of Horizons' grantmaking portfolio, Community Issues grants are awarded to LGBT organizations and projects throughout the nine Bay Area counties and address a wide range of populations and issues. To ensure that these grants respond to evolving community needs, Horizons actively engages a diverse panel of volunteers to review proposals and recommend grants. In 2009, Horizons awarded 32 Community Issues grants totaling **\$217,948**.

Community Issues grants are made possible in large part by the generosity of hundreds of Horizons donors, including those whose bequests and planned gifts have supported Horizons Foundation's LGBT Community Endowment Fund. The grants are also funded in part by support from the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation.

# 2009 HIV/AIDS COMMUNITY GRANTS

The HIV/AIDS Community Grants are made to organizations working to ensure access to AIDS treatments, stop the spread of HIV, and offer critically needed housing assistance and other services to people living with HIV/AIDS. In 2009, this program supported 62 organizations with **\$246,000** in grants.

For more than a decade, Horizons Foundation has proudly partnered with the San Francisco AIDS Foundation (SFAF) to administer the HIV/AIDS Community Grants, which are supported through the proceeds of the San Francisco AIDS Walk. As SFAF looked at their programs aimed at ending the pandemic, they realized they'd have the capacity to bring this grantmaking program back in-house starting in 2010.

It has been our honor to be entrusted with the HIV/AIDS Community Grants since 1999, and we are thrilled that SFAF will continue to provide much-needed resources to the organizations and programs dedicated to the radical reduction of HIV and its impact in the Bay Area.

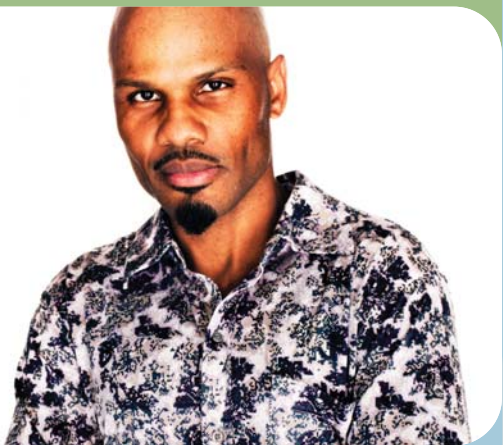

# 2009 LGBT WISE GRANTS

The LGBT WISE: Working to Improve Services to Elders grants continued in 2009 through Horizons' partnership with The California Wellness Foundation. This landmark program increases the capacity of LGBT organizations in the Bay Area to provide services to LGBT elders, a population that is critically underserved—and growing. Programs eligible for funding include food and nutrition services, access to health care, and in-home support for elders. In addition to receiving funding, the LGBT WISE grantees also meet regularly to foster peer learning and create practical connections among different regions in the Bay Area. The 2009 LGBT WISE grants totaled **\$113,744**.

# 2009 POCIBLE GRANT

In 2009, Horizons Foundation launched a new grant program called POCIBLE (People of Color Initiative to Build Leadership and Effectiveness). To help a core of people of color LGBT organizations and individuals develop the capacity to play sustaining leadership roles in the LGBT community, Horizons has made investing in this area one of our grantmaking priorities. We awarded 22 POCIBLE grants in 2009—including five Rickey Williams Fellowships—totaling **\$224,000**.

In total, donor-advised and other named funds at Horizons distributed \$985,230 in 2009—an extraordinary mark of our community's commitment to giving and to giving openly as LGBT people. Horizons is proud to be part of this work.

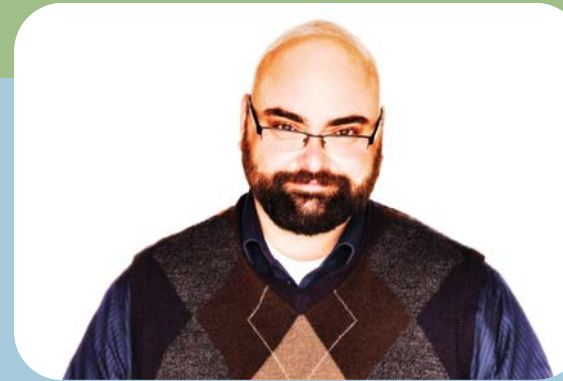
