Horizons Foundation is best known for our grantmaking, which focuses on lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) organizations and causes in the San Francisco Bay Area. For 30 years, our grants have provided direct financial support to LGBT nonprofits across issues, populations, and geography.

In 2010, we made **512 grants totaling \$1,798,392** to help strengthen the LGBT community. We are deeply grateful to the individual donors, community organizations, and collaborating foundations and corporations who made this possible.

In Horizons' wide-ranging portfolio of grants, many grantees were selected using community-led grantmaking processes, while others came from donor-advised and special funds. Together, the grants—funded thanks to our generous donors, institutional partners, and the LGBT Community Endowment Fund—represent support for the full spectrum of advocacy, services, and programs that make the next generation of progress possible for the LGBT community.

2010 Community Issues Grants

The cornerstone of Horizons' grantmaking portfolio, Community Issues grants are awarded to LGBT organizations and projects throughout the nine Bay Area counties and address a wide range of populations and issues. To ensure that these grants respond to evolving community needs, Horizons actively engages a diverse panel of volunteers to review proposals and recommend grants. In 2010 Horizons awarded 28 Community Issues grants totaling **\$200,902**.*

Community Issues grants are made possible in large part by the generosity of hundreds of Horizons donors, including those whose bequests and planned gifts have supported Horizons Foundation's LGBT Community Endowment Fund. The grants are also funded in part by support from the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation and the San Francisco Foundation.

* NOTE: San Francisco Pride at Work and San Francisco Trans March were also selected as 2010 Community Issues grantees. However, because the funds were issued in early 2011, the organizations are not included in the 2010 grant totals.

2010 LGBT WISE Grants

The LGBT WISE: Working to Improve Services to Elders grants continued in 2010 through Horizons' partnership with The California Wellness Foundation. This landmark program increases the capacity of LGBT organizations in the Bay Area to provide services to LGBT elders, a population that is critically underserved—and growing. Programs eligible for funding include food and nutrition services, access to healthcare, and in-home support for elders. In addition to receiving funding, the LGBT WISE grantees also meet regularly to foster peer learning and create practical connections among different regions in the Bay Area. The 2010 LGBT WISE grants totaled **\$60,000**.

2010 POCCE Grants

Horizons Foundation launched a new grant program in 2010 called POCCE (People of Color Creating Equality). Through a variety of strategies—including radio programs, storytelling, canvassing, research, and message testing—these grantees worked to increase support for same-sex marriage in communities of color in California. We awarded nine POCCE grants in 2010 totaling **\$350,000**.

2010 POCIBLE Grants

In 2010, Horizons Foundation made the second year of grants through our program called POCIBLE (People of Color Initiative to Build Leadership and Effectiveness). To help a core of people of color LGBT organizations and individuals develop the capacity to play sustaining leadership roles in the LGBT community, Horizons has made investing in this area one of our grantmaking priorities. We awarded 24 POCIBLE grants in 2010—including four Rickey Williams Fellowships—totaling **\$221,200**.

In total, donor-advised and other named funds at Horizons distributed **\$963,986** in 2010—an extraordinary mark of our community's commitment to giving and to giving openly as LGBT people. Horizons is proud to be part of this work.
