

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. I've never held a hammer in my life; can I still work on a construction site?

We welcome volunteers of ALL skill levels and we provide the training necessary for the task at hand.

2. How old do I or the members of my group have to be to volunteer?

All volunteers must be at least 16 years old to work on the construction site. Those ages 16-17 need to bring a waiver (provided on our website) signed by a parent or guardian.

3. What safety information should I know?

Habitat's construction team will train you on all the safety information you need to know but we encourage you to view the safety videos located on our website prior to volunteering.

4. Is there street parking near the site?

Street parking is <u>extremely limited</u> near the construction site and there's no parking at the site. Volunteers are strongly encouraged to take public transportation to avoid parking headaches. And <u>buses can NOT drive on Capitol Ave</u>.

5. It's raining. What do I do?

Don't fret! We often build during rain, depending on the stage of construction. If it's raining the morning of your build, call 415-625-1038 after 7 a.m. A recording will alert you if the build day has been cancelled.

6. What should I wear?

Sturdy, closed-toed shoes and rugged clothes like jeans and t-shirts that you don't mind getting dirty are a must. Also, since much of the work we do is outdoors, bring layers appropriate for sudden changes in weather. Leave jewelry at home.

7. What should I bring?

Please bring a water bottle plus sunscreen, jackets, hats or sunglasses. We'll provide the tools and hard hats. Leave valuables at home as there's no secure storage onsite.

8. Can I leave early?

We ask for a full day commitment from our volunteers; Arriving late or leaving early means we can't properly train volunteers or may mean we can't finish important work.

TYPICAL WORKDAY SCHEDULE

| 8:30-8:45 | Volunteers arrive, check in & get hardhats |

| 1:00-4:00 | More construction! |
| 4:00-4:30 | Cleanup and dismissal |

SITE DIRECTIONS

To 1 Capitol Ave., San Francisco. Due to limited parking we encourage volunteers to take public transportation or carpool.

PUBLIC TRANSIT

From Daly City BART, walk north on DeLong St. for .5 miles. Turn Left onto Crystal St. Turn left onto Alemany Blvd.

54 Bus (also leaves from both Balboa and Daly City BART stations) and stops at Sagamore St. and Capitol Ave.

MUNI M lightrail stops at Broad St. and Capitol Ave. Walk .1 mile south on Capitol, past Sagamore St.

DRIVING

From the South via I-280N, near the John Daly Blvd exit, KEEP LEFT toward CA-1/19th Ave/Golden Gate Bridge. Stay in RIGHT LANE after CA-1/19th Ave split and EXIT at Alemany Blvd. Take Alemany Blvd past Sagamore St. and park under the freeway.

From the North via I-280S, take Exit 50 for CA-1 North/San Jose Ave/Mission St through 2 traffic lights on San Jose Ave. Right on DeLong St after 7/11, right at the first stop onto Crystal, left onto Alemany for parking.

From the North via 19th Ave/CA-1, merge onto Junipero Serra. Exit Alemeny Blvd/Cow Palace. Merge onto Brotherhood Way. Slight right onto Alemany and park under the freeway.

Note: Buses can NOT drive on Capitol Ave. even for unloading.



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
