

2018 SAN FRANCISCO / BAY AREA LGBTQ NEEDS ASSESSMENT

LGBTQ COMMUNITY **NEEDS STILL** UNMET


Across the five geographic regions (San Francisco, North Bay, South Bay, East Bay, Northeast Bay), LGBTQ community members responding to the survey reported differences in ability to meet basic needs and access needed services, sense of connection and safety, and experience of civic engagement and political representation.

TOP THREE SERVICES NEEDED BUT NOT ABLE TO ACCESS



GREATER UNMET NEEDS

LGBTQ respondents were more likely to have greater unmet basic needs AND unable to access needed services if they:

Have an income of less than \$60,000 per year

Do not have a Bachelor's

degree or higher educational

Are people of color

Are bisexual

Are transgender MB.

Are non-binary/genderqueer

Are younger than 25

Ever lived in foster care Have a disability

CONCERNS ABOUT SAFETY

indicated that concerns about their safety limit where they can live (60%), work (55%) and get health care (54%)
